The Stock Market Game™ is a national program of the Foundation for Investor Education and is offered in Kentucky by the Kentucky Council on Economic Education (KCEE). It is an interactive, interdisciplinary program for students in grades 4-12 (and college) to learn about economics, finance, and our American economic system. The program is offered each Fall and Spring. Over a period of 15 weeks, teams of students research companies, make investment decisions, and create their portfolios, investing \$100,000 in imaginary money in stocks and

mutual funds. Teams are ranked on equity in portfolio. Teachers are provided with educational resources to teach students about investing, capital formation, the stock market, and the economy. Student teams compete against other Kentucky teams statewide and across local regions for prizes.

**For Spring 2007, 725 teams of 2,894 students and 99 teachers participated in our Stock market Game competition.** Another 506 teams of 2,082 students and 67 teachers took part in the Take Stock in Kentucky competition this Fall, with Louisville Male High School taking first place in the state.

Winning teams held a diversified selection of stocks, with the top ranked teams holding winning stocks like, Industrial Services of America (IDSA); Cummins, Inc. (CMI); AK Steel Holding Corp. (AKS); Unites States Steel (X); and Simulations Plus (SLP).

Stock Market Game awards include: 1st place prize of \$300, 2nd place of \$200, and 3<sup>rd</sup> place of \$100 to be used by the school, class, or team, plus \$50 for a class pizza party. The first place state awards team will receive class trophies and medals at the Kentucky Council on Economic Education Annual Awards program in May, 2007. The top 10 teams in the state will all receive Stock Market Game Winners Tshirts. The top team in each region will also receive a check for \$50 for the team or class.
